# 1. THE FLYING COMES FIRST (ISAIAH 40:31)

#### Isaiah 40:31 HCSB

31 ... those who trust in the Lord will renew their strength; they will soar on wings like eagles; they will run and not grow weary; they will walk and not faint.

Flying is the first phase of the Abundant Christian Life – A life that Rocks. It comes before running, before walking, even before crawling. This "Flight of Faith" is the foundation for experiencing life beyond your wildest expectations. It is the starting line for running the race. It is the reassurance to keep walking. It is the power to stand strong in the face of the battle. Flying is the evidence of faith, the breeding ground of faith, the fertile soil of faith, the nutrition for faith, and the test of faith. So what does God mean by this "soaring," this "flying?"

The flight of faith happens when God takes you out of your own limits and understanding and leads you to do something that seems impossible. He gives you a work to do. You don't have the knowledge, the strength, or the resources, and you're terrified. But He invites you, calls you, pleads with you to do it anyway. At this point, you have two choices: shrink back to the safety of where you've been, or jump. If you shrink back, if you decide to stay where you are, you deny Christ's lordship in your life and you miss out on the abundance He wants for you. If Jesus Christ is really your Lord, when he calls you to do the impossible, you do it. You may be terrified. You may not have the resources you think you need. It may look like certain disaster, like you'll fail miserably, that you'll be a laughing stock, that you will suffer rejection and end up alone. But when God calls you to jump, it is not the time to stick your toe in the water to see if it's comfortably warm or sufficiently safe. That's not even possible. It is all or nothing. When you are certain that God is telling you to do the impossible or the unpopular, it's not time to go ask your friends, acquaintances, employer, even mentor if you should do it. You may have them help you make certain it is God who is calling you out, but if it is God, then you JUMP.

#### **Personal testimony**

April 2004. God said, "Jim, unless you leave where you are, I can't take you to where I want you to be." I knew immediately it meant leaving my job and trusting Him. He didn't tell me where we were going or where the money was coming from to support

my family, and He doesn't have to. When he spoke that sentence to me, I knew instantly of five things he required me to do and not one of them was easy. I had a good paying job, a wife, three kids, a house, two cars, a huge amount of debt that I thought I'd never be able to pay off, and an addiction that I could not kick. And in the middle of all that God called me out. He blew me away. But I was already at the point of no return. I had already decided that I would follow God wherever He chose to take me.

#### Complete Surrender – Eric Liddell

You may have seen the story of Olympian Eric Liddell in the movie, Chariots of Fire. Eric's life takes a different turn after the close of the move. After winning the Olympics, Liddell went back to China, where he had been raised, to live out his life as a missionary to the Chinese people. He would end up dying there in a prison a number of years later. His life ambition was total surrender to Christ.

When talking later about his decision to follow God's call, Eric said,

"It was no longer 'all or nothing' – that point had been passed. It was now, simply, 'all.'"

And that's where I was, and by God's grace, still am. I surrender to do whatever He leads me to do, regardless of how outlandish it may seem.

The giant step in the walk of faith is the one we take when we decide God no longer is a part of our lives—He is our life.

# 2. GOD IS OUR FLIGHT INSTRUCTOR (DEUTERONOMY 32:9-11 (NIV))

But God does not ask us to jump and then leave us alone. You've probably heard the old quote:

#### Anonymous - "Let Go"

When God leads you to the edge of the cliff, trust Him fully and let go. Only one of two things will happen: either He'll catch you when you fall, or He'll teach you how to fly!

In this picture in Deuteronomy, it is God Himself who teaches us to fly. God loves us and wants each one of us to fly. We are exceedingly important to Him and He wants the very best for us. But we get too comfortable in the nest. No matter what our life is like, we get scared when God calls us to do the un-do-able. So He stirs things up, makes us uncomfortable until we are willing to climb out of the nest. Then, like a mother eagle with her eaglet. he takes us on His wings and we feel like we've been on a spiritual high. The next thing we know, we are plummeting through the air...

This applies both to us and individuals and to us corporately as the church. God is asking FBC Lake Dallas to fly...to make a choice to step out beyond our comfort zone...to risk...to fly. And we must do so or die.

# 3. THERE WILL BE MULTIPLE FLIGHTS OF FAITH

When God called me out in 2004 and I chose to obey, it was hard on the family. But they supported me. Interestingly, the greatest amount of rejection came from people in the church. When others heard about my decision, they thought I was crazy or deluded. I was told, "God wouldn't tell you to leave your job without telling you where you were going first." Tell that to **Noah**. Try that with **Abraham**. Did God line out everything he was calling Moses to do from the burning bush? What about **Daniel** who trusted God even though he knew he would end up in the lions' den? Or **Rahab** who risked her life to trust God and hide the Israelite spies?

### **Heroes of Faith**

And what more can I say? Time is too short for me to tell about Gideon, Barak, Samson, Jephthah, David, Samuel, and the prophets, <sup>33</sup> who by faith conquered kingdoms, administered justice, obtained promises, shut the mouths of lions, <sup>34</sup> quenched the raging of fire, escaped the edge of the sword, gained strength after being weak, became mighty in battle, and put foreign armies to flight. <sup>35</sup> Women received their dead—they were raised to life again. Some men were tortured, not accepting release, so that they might gain a better resurrection, <sup>36</sup> and others experienced mockings and scourgings, as well as bonds and imprisonment. <sup>37</sup> They were stoned, <sup>[k]</sup> they were sawed in two, they died by the sword, they wandered about in sheepskins, in goatskins, destitute, afflicted, and mistreated. <sup>38</sup> The world was not worthy of them. They wandered in deserts and on mountains, hiding in caves and holes in the ground.

# 4. FLYING IS MANDATORY IN THE CHRISTIAN LIFE

- <sup>17</sup> In the same way faith, if it doesn't have works, is dead by itself. ...

For just as the body without the spirit is dead, so also faith without works is dead.

Slide 21

Doing what God has asked, invited, called or told you to do is an act of obedience and faith that proves that you've made Him Lord of your life. If you don't believe and therefore don't do what God's called you to do, James says you don't have faith and therefore can't prove that Jesus is your Lord. You may have heard it said that the response, "No, Lord" is an oxymoron – a self-contradictory statement. If Christ asks you to do something and you say "no" then He isn't your Lord – you've just rejected His Lordship. If Christ asks you to do something and He's your Lord, you can't say "no."
